Garden 1

Address: Woodside, Wood Lane, Goostrey, CW4 8NE

Parking: Forest Avenue or Eaton Lane

Wheelchair Friendly: No

Hazards: Steps

This large garden consists of several formal borders to the front and rear of the house with a mix of shrubs, herbaceous and seasonal bedding plants. Trees in the garden include pear, silver birch, poplar, pine, copper beech, oak, cracked willow, cherry blossom and cypress. There is a vegetable plot to the rear. Lawns cover a large area and are kept pristine in front of house, a little less so at the rear which includes a re-wilded meadow.

All are cared for by Ken the amazing gardener.

Ivy, Virginia creeper and winter flowering jasmine cover the house. Many songbirds occupy these and the thick hedges that surround the garden.

Garden 2

Address: 10 Meadow Avenue, Goostrey, CW4 8LS

Parking: Meadow Avenue Wheelchair Friendly: Yes

Hazards: Steps

A mini vineyard in the heart of Goostrey! Following a visit to the RHS show at Tatton Park in 2016, this gardener decided to grow vines as a retirement project. This has now taken over the small garden with about 40 vines reaching maturity. The varieties chosen are developed to ripen the grapes in cooler climates. They make quite reasonable wine and keep this gardener busy from spring to autumn and for two days in January! Please visit to find out a lot more.

Parking: Boothbed Road or Meadow Avenue

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes

Hazards: No

This garden is cleverly designed to include three distinct areas. The front includes a conifer rockery, mixed beds and planted containers. Pass through a gate to a lawned area with a raised bed of roses, perennials and annuals. There are mature shrubs and containers. The third area is fronted by a large summer house and consists of a cobbled and pebble area planted with mature shrubs. This leads to a paved area with seating, a raised bed and several containers.

Mini Event: Cakes and water will be served

Children's Challenge: Can you find the black metal cat?

Garden 4

Address: Westwood, New Platt Lane, Goostrey, CW4 8NJ

Parking: New Platt Lane

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes but gravel drive and no access to woodland area

Hazards: Boardwalk and deep pond in woodland area

Westwood is a re-sized garden following the recent development of surrounding houses, when care was taken to preserve as many of the original trees as possible. The flower garden to the front of the house was once grass. To the rear of the house is a woodland area, which was totally overgrown and unusable. Time and toil have been invested into introducing a pond, clearing large areas and adding the construction of a boardwalk. There are raised beds for vegetables and fruits, a greenhouse housing tomatoes and borders that have flourished despite poor soil. The centrepiece in the rear garden is a large sequoia. Children and adults alike may enjoy feeling its soft and spongy bark.

Mini Event: Refreshments will be served in the garden

Children's Challenge: Can you count the hidden butterflies?

Garden 5

Address: Hornbeam House, New Platt Lane, Goostrey, CW4 8NJ

Parking: New Platt Lane

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes (gravel drive)

Hazards: No

Five years ago this new build garden was just rubble, turf and paving stones but is now maturing well with two raised beds filled with colourful cut flowers, two outdoor entertaining areas, a lawn and a water feature which backs onto the shady woodland setting beyond. New this year is a small experimental wild flower patch in a shady area!

Mini Event: Pimms and Elderflower presse

Children's Challenge: Can you spot the metal bird feeder?

Address: Holly Tree Cottage, Twemlow Lane, Cranage, CW4 8EX

Parking: Twemlow Lane

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes - restricted in places

Hazards: Pond and steps

This couple moved in with their dog Peppa 7 years ago with the lawn, most of the borders and trees already established. After a major extension along with the addition of 3 children in the past 5 years it is now a practical family garden. A work in progress which continues to see additions each year. These include a vegetable garden and Wendy house, solar panels and a 5000L rain water harvesting tank and a hen coop. In 2024 there will be a new potato patch, wild flower area and the latest project is an upgrade to the pond.

Garden 7

Address: Hollins Farm, Twemlow Lane, Cranage, CW4 8GE

Parking: Plenty of parking for vehicles is available at the farm

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes


Hazards: This is a working dairy farm, please remain in garden areas only.


A variety of herbaceous borders and colour themed perennial plantings surround the house. In the Fire Garden an interchangeable system of pots (tulips, peonies and dahlias) nestle amongst the spring daffodils and cornus. Shady woodland beds in the Spring Garden contain countless bulbs, ferns, astilbes and a box wheel of white planting. Herbs are central to the Wellbeing Garden, a relaxing outdoor space for staff at the Granary Business Centre. An orchard and wildlife area give views to a small lake and the new woodland planted recently with approximately 500 trees and hedging.

Mini Event: Barbara Wilkinson DBTh MURHP Consultant Medical Herbalist and Naturopath will be available in the wellbeing garden to answer your questions on herbs and well being. Refreshments available in aid of The Storehouse Foodbank in Congleton

Address: Meadow Bank Barn, Mill Lane, Goostrey, CW4 8PW

Parking: 2/3 spaces for disabled parking but would prefer visitors to walk or cycle

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes

Hazards: No

The owners are delighted to be opening their garden again. Subtle but significant changes have been made which have helped open up a fairly congested area and have brought benefits to the ground cover planting and other trees in the bed. Sitting behind a mature hedge on Mill Lane, the garden consists of a number of distinct garden areas, including a vegetable plot and flower garden which aims to ensure cut flowers are grown to adorn the house from March to October, along with fruit and vegetables for the kitchen.

Garden 9

Address: 9 Woodlands Drive, Goostrey, CW4 8JH

Parking: Woodlands Drive Wheelchair Friendly: Yes

Hazards: Small pond

Since retiring, the owners of this formerly borderless, deeply shaded garden have created colourful borders, with little knowledge of what should go where and when. There are several small seating areas and a new arbour, with star jasmine slowly climbing up it. A garden seat is shaded by a newly established wisteria, next to a small water feature. The owners like nothing better than to entertain outside and enjoy the birds, insects and

other animals that come to feed.

Garden 10

Address: 64 Brooklands Drive, Goostrey, CW4 8JD

Children's Challenge: Can you spot the metal lizard?

Parking: Brooklands Drive

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes - restricted in places

Hazards: Steps

Fifty years ago this gardener was bought a little acer. It cost £1.50 and has travelled ever since to four different houses. It also started a passion, some say an obsession for acers. So come and visit this garden and enjoy this large, fascinating collection of acers, mainly in pots, allowing this gardener to rearrange and showcase different acers as their colours change.

Children's Challenge: Can you find the hare?

Parking: Brooklands Drive or Manor Avenue **Wheelchair Friendly:** Yes with assistance

Hazards: Steps and stream

Truly a secret garden in the heart of Goostrey. A plot of nearly 1.5 acres, invisible from the road, and almost completely screened from all of its neighbours by foliage. The garden runs down to the Red Lion Brook. Lots of grass, trees, space, seclusion and tranquillity; hardly any flowers, but a nice striped lawn! Come and enjoy the view of the garden and the Bongs while taking tea on the terrace.

Mini Event: Sale of tea, coffee and cakes (from noon) Children's Challenge: Can you find the stream?



Garden 12

Address: High Field, Blackden, CW4 8DQ

Parking: In the field at the house. One way system in operation

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes

Hazards: Ponds. Access to this farm is via a narrow country road. Pedestrians are advised to use footpath provided on map.

Originally owned as a semi-detached house, the two houses and garden were amalgamated in 2019. The beautiful garden is now in its fourth year, and has evolved and matured to house a formal area to the front of the Orangery, a drift of wild flowers sweeping down the middle of the lawn, a Rose Arch and a Cornish stone water feature. The planting is in the main naturalistic and bird and insect friendly and there are two ponds planted up for wildlife which attract frogs, toads, dragonflies etc. The old well is used to support the produce in the greenhouse.

Mini Event: Coffee, tea and cakes for sale

Children's Challenge: Can you spot the date stone on the house marking the year it was built?

Address: The Old Vicarage, Church Bank, Goostrey, CW4 8PG

Parking: Church Bank, Space Invader, Crown Pub

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes

Hazards: Steps and some steep drops in the upper garden

A multi-level walled garden tucked behind St Luke's Church. The garden has been designed to support nature. With a wild flower meadow, a pond and dry hedges it has encouraged a wide range of insects, birds and small animals to take up residence. The upper terraces closest to the house in the shadow of the church provide seating surrounded by more formal planting with wonderful views of the meadow and pond below.

Mini Event: Information and examples of wildlife spotting and gardening for nature will feature in this garden, in addition to re-purposing household items and packaging for use in the garden.

Children's Challenge: Can you spot the hedgehog house?

Additional Advice: Speak to the owners about wildlife spotting and gardening for nature.

Garden 14

Address: The Grange, 21B Station Road, Goostrey, CW4 8PJ

Parking: Station Road, Goostrey Station, paid car park

Wheelchair Friendly: Yes

Hazards: Water Feature

Large herbaceous borders crammed with well-known favourites such as roses, peonies, lupins and poppies blend softly in a naturalistic painting style, alongside specialist finds collected over the years. Herbaceous beds give way to a sunny alpine area which takes you to through to a hidden spot with shrub roses and grasses. You can meander through the fruit, vegetable and cut flower garden or take a seat and relax by the pond or in the shady and fern area. The soft hum of bees is never far away, and the wilderness areas provide a hiding place for garden friendly insects.

Mini Event: Paintings by Helen, Margaret and friends will be on display in the garden.

Children's Challenge: Can you find the secret path around the pond to the water feature?

Garden 15

Address: 57 Station Road, Goostrey, CW4 8PJ

Parking: Station Road, Goostrey Station, paid car park

Wheelchair Friendly: No - Restricted width of entrance and steps are not passable in a wheelchair.

Hazards: Steps leading down to the garden

A small, wildlife friendly, cottage garden brimming with trees, shrubs and perennials, overlooking Jodrell Bank Radio Telescope. Home to award winning gooseberry trees, resident frog and a haven for pollinators. New for 2024 a remodelled border. A cornucopia of horticultural delight

Children's Challenge: Can you spot the stone hedgehog?

Additional Advice: Speak to the owners about the art of champion gooseberry growing.

Important Notes

- You will need to show your ticket as you enter each garden.
- No dogs except for guide dogs in gardens please.
- Park sensibly (see each garden description for advice) and try to walk or cycle between gardens wherever possible.
- We advise visitors to garden number 12 to walk or cycle along the signed footpath leading from Station Road. Please do not attempt to walk up Church Bank or Blackden as it is extremely narrow with fast traffic.
- You will not be able to use the toilets in any of the host gardeners' homes. There are toilets available at Pastimes Cafe (Patrons only) on Main Road, at the Crown pub and at The Space Invader pub and gardens 7 and 12.
- All children under 16 must be accompanied by a responsible adult.
- Please be aware that some plants and flowers may be poisonous to humans or animals.
- Mini events will be cash only.
- Please view map for appropriate walking times to outlying gardens.
